We operate in developing countries, partnering with communities in order to empower at-risk children and enable them to thrive. Funding and donor support is channeled directly into distinct projects that can include greenhouses, farms, renewable energy and similar efforts that encourage selfsufficiency and enrich the community at large. We meet our goal of helping each at-risk child reach his/her full potential and lead a dignified life, by providing access to education, quality nutrition, social support, and re-integration with family when possible.

GREENHOUSE -MIGORI, KENYA


The greenhouse will generate income for St. Catherine's educational programs in Kibera, and provide nutritious fruits and vegetables to over 70 children.


CHICKEN FARM -TUNI, INDIA

Income generated from the sale of eggs and older chickens will pay for the computer lab at the home, as well as the provision of additional fruits for over 80 children

GREENHOUSE -NAKURU, KENYA

Income has allowed the home to hire a full time social worker to assist in re-integrating the over 200 children at the home. 17 children have been re-united with their families so far.

GREENHOUSE - JOURNEY OF HOPE 2017

The greenhouse project at Journey of Hope will provide income so that the organization can continue their outreach program, which supports over 100 children and their families through paying for educational needs. This preventative program keeps families together, as many children are often placed in orphanages when parents cannot afford to pay for school. The organization also has a home where 20 children live, those children are true orphans and the project will provide nutritious foods as well as help pay for the qualified and committed staff at the home.

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EXIT STRATEGY AND REINTEGRATION TRAINING 2017

In partnership with the government of Kenya's Children's District office, Kitechild will be hosting a series of trainings on the best practices for exiting a child out of an orphanage, whether when they age out, or because they are eligible to be re-united with their families or communities. The goal is to provide support as children transition out of the orphanage system, and also to aid those children that can leave the system as soon as possible. Orphanages should be viewed as emergency temporary shelter situations, but they are often necessary when a child has no other option for housing and safety.
